STRATEGIC DIRECTION OF THE DISTRICT

The Strategic direction of the district as set in the goal of the 5 year District Development Plan IV is 'Achieve higher household income, full monetization and employment for sustainable socio-economic transformation of the people of Tororo district'. This goal is to be achieved under the overall theme of Strengthening District's wealth creation through infrastructure development, reduction of Gender Based Violence, innovation and value addition guided by good governance.

STRATEGIC OBJBCTTVES OF THE DISTRICT

- 1. To sustainably increase production, productivity and value addition in agriculture, industry, minerals, oil & gas, tourism, ICT and financial services;
- 2. To enhance human capital development along the entire life cycle;
- 3. To support the private sector to drive growth and create jobs;
- 4. To build and maintain strategic sustainable infrastructure in transport, housing, energy, water, industry and ICT; and
- 5. To strengthen good governance, security, and the role of the State in development.

KEY ACHIEVEMENTS

- In the administration sector, constructed sub county office blocks.
- In the health sector, health facility upgrades from H/C II to H/C III.
- In the works and technical services sector; under roads several kilometres of district roads were maintained, while under water several boreholes were drilled, rehabilitated and piped water was extended to water stressed areas
- In the production sector, partial Construction of the veterinary mini-laboratory with an incinerator at the district veterinary ground, micro irrigation schemes for demonstration were also established, Supply, delivery and distribution of 3 motorcycles
- In education pit five stance pit latrines were constructed in several schools, classroom block construction and rehabilitations also took place in several schools, procured and distributed 3 seater desks to some primary schools, construction of three seed secondary school is underway.
- In the community development sector, community members have benefited from livelihood programmes like Uganda Women Entrepreneurship, special grant for persons with disabilities, Social Assistance Grant for empowerment (SAGE)
- Several households have accessed funds under pillar 3 of PDM of financial inclusion and EMYOGA.

Challenges

- 1. A large proportion of households (53%) are still in the subsistence economy and majority are women and children involved in production with less power to control the proceeds.
- 2. A large proportion of the households drive their livelihood from subsistence agriculture 77.4%
- 3. Insufficient creation of quality and gainful jobs in the economy, especially for the youth and women.
- 4. Inadequate staffing. Only 42% of the positions are filled
- 5. Severe reduction in the forest cover as well as wetland degradation and encroachment by especially the male.
- 6. Dwindling local revenues insufficient to fund local service delivery.
- 7. The Quality of education remains low characterized by the low levels of literacy and numeracy, coupled with the high rate of school dropout and especially among the girl child.
- 8. Inadequate functionality of some health facilities and rising cases of non-communicable diseases.
- 9. Increasing population and land fragmentation with an increase in gender based violence incidences in families.
- 10. Poor attitudes toward work coupled with high level of alcoholism.
- 11. Increasing levels gender based violence by both male and female.
- 12. High costs for road maintenance works.
- 13. Poor ground water resources. Many parts of the district have poor ground water potential making construction of bore holes especially very difficult.

Recommendations

- More priority investment should be considered in agriculture and sustainable use of natural resources.
- To increase forest cover in the district through private/community/ institutional tree planting for incomes, livelihoods, conservation of soils and ecosystems and climate change mitigation.
- Conserve water resources and wetland ecosystems in wetlands through demarcation and restoration with trees and grass.
- There is need for rigorous lobbying for additional funds to support more infrastructural development projects within the district such as construction and maintenance of district roads, school infrastructure, health infrastructure and market infrastructure.
- The district needs to intensify local revenue collection from the existing sources and equally identify new ones.
- Need to strengthen local revenue collection using the integrated revenue administration system (IRAS)
- Ministry of finance and Ministry of Public Service should ensure Local governments have adequate wage to recruit all critical staff.
- Continue sensitizing farmers with reliable sources of water on the benefits of irrigation towards mitigation of increasing climate change effects.

LIVELIHOOD PROGRAMME IMPLEMENTATION IN THE DISTRICT

PARISH DEVELOPMENT MODEL PILLAR 3 (FINANCIAL INCLUSION) IMPLEMENTATION

Tororo District has 180 parishes (172 in the rural sub counties and town councils while 8 are located in the Municipality). Of the 172 parishes, 155 parishes are currently participating in PDM under pillar 3. 17 parishes have not been coded by Ministry of Finance to enable them participate in PDM pillar 3 component.

Challenges with PDM pillar 3 implementation

- Poor network coverage in some parishes is equally slowing disbursement process.
- Lack of Post bank Wendi Agents in some parishes is affecting access of funds by beneficiaries after disbursement has been made to their phones number.
- There have been some alleged cases of extortion by some PDM Sacco leaders in some parishes/wards.
- Some PDM beneficiaries diverted funds to unproductive activities not planned.

Recommendation

- Network service providers should expand coverage to include areas affected in the rural setting.
- Post to continue with identification and on board of Wendi agents in the parishes/wards

- Continuous monitoring and community baraza should be done in order to minimize such occurrences.
- Sensitization and monitoring of beneficiaries by Sacco leaders, PDC members, Sub county political/technical staff and District leadership on mindset change so as to address issue of funds diversion

Challenges with Emyooga

- Poor loan repayment by Emyooga beneficiaries which has hindered smooth operations of the Saccos
- Inadequate Revolving Fund; Some of the SACCOS for instance Produce Dealers, Women Entrepreneurs and Market Vendors SACCOs have very big number of beneficiaries.
- Low rate of member economic participation / patronage; Group members are expected to contribute towards additional capital and savings to their Saccos, but this is not the case in instead their saving deposits are made to attract loans immediately.

Recommendation

- Regular follow up of loan defaulters by both Emyooga Sacco executives and Association group leaders.
- Special consideration be made for Saccos with higher number of members.
- Continuous sensitization of emyooga beneficiaries on the value of savings in the Sacco
